The Legacy and the Future Bombay Natural History Society

The Bombay Natural History Society (BNHS), founded on September 11, 1883, is one of India's oldest and most significant non-governmental organizations dedicated to promoting scientific knowledge for the benefit of our natural environment.

From its origins as an assembly of like-minded individuals, BNHS has evolved into a scientific, reputation-building organization and a platform for national conservation initiatives. Its leading projects, that conservation must be based on scientific research, remain central to its work, underpinning efforts to safeguard forests, rivers, wetlands, coasts, and mountain areas. The study of threatened and lesser-known species such as Great Indian Bustard, lesser and greater Indian vultures, Asian elephant, giant otter, Indian rhinoceros, langur, and Asiatic cheetah are some examples of our conservation efforts.


The Society's Conservation Education Centre (CEC) in Mumbai, includes its commitment to fostering a broad-based constituency of nature enthusiasts whose members can engage directly with the natural world. Through hands-on research into species conservation, herpetology and ecology and education the CEC nurtures the next generation of scientists, educators, and informed citizens.

As the seat of BNHS's research, library, the journal of the Bombay Natural History Society (JBNHS) that has been in continuous publication since January 1986. Complementing this academic rigor is the accessible quarterly magazine, *Santhosh* 1976.

Membership offers tangible benefits and opportunities to participate in research, publish findings, engage in citizen science initiatives, and join a community committed to protecting India's natural heritage. Programs include field courses and weekend monitoring, among others, educate participants while generating critical data on species health and ecosystem integrity.

By integrating research with community engagement, the Society is shaping a future in which conservation leads to a more resilient and ecologically vibrant world, one where the very fabric of life—whether studying bird migration patterns or the hidden diversity of forests and wetlands—is preserved, understood, and harnessed for generations to come.

BNHS is registered under the Society's Registration Act XXI of 1860 and Registered as a Public Trust under Bombay Public Trust Act, 1950.

Section 80 G: General Donations to all BNHS activities on Object of the Trust. An amount equal to 50% of any some paid U/s 80 (G) can be claimed by the assessee as deduction.

Section 35 (1) (ii): Exclusively for scientific research: An amount equal to 175% of any some paid U/s 35(1) (ii) can be claimed by the assessee having income chargeable under the head business and profession as deduction.

100% deduction U/s 80 GGA is available to assessee for donation made for scientific research and rural development, whose gross total income does not include income which is chargeable under the head 'Profit and gain of business and profession', as deduction. This is applicable as per prevailing I.T. rules.

1. Donation for Indian Skimmer

Indian Skimmer is listed as Endangered, with an estimated population of less than 2,500 mature individuals. BNHS studies at Chambal revealed that low nesting success due to predation and trampling of nests are the main reasons for their population decline. In response to the situation, we launched the 'Helping Skimmer Skim' conservation program, incorporating the 'Guardians of Skimmer' initiative. This initiative provides direct protection of nesting colonies by trained local community members as nest guardians. Our conservation intervention has significantly improved the nest survival rates. We earnestly appeal to individuals, trusts, corporate bodies and funding agencies to generously contribute to our cause. Your support is pivotal in safeguarding the Indian Skimmer.

2. Donation for Vulture Project

The challenge is to ensure that the system is free from harmful veterinary painkillers such as diclofenac, so that captive-bred vultures can be released back into the wild. BNHS bears the expenses of feeding and breeding vultures in captivity, maintaining the four Vulture Conservation Breeding Centres and creating awareness at different levels of the society.
